Group Member Role Description

Purpose

The Denver Art Museum is working towards a just, fair, and inclusive society in which all people, immaterial of their race or ethnicity, can participate, prosper, and reach their full potential. The Youth, Community and Engagement (YC&E) team is looking to recruit the second cohort of the Youth Advisory Group (YAG) which can represent some of the diverse voices in the Denver Metro community for the museum's programming. The Advisory Group will support the DAM's efforts to listen deeply to and center diverse voices (a variety of racial, cultural, linguistic, regional, and socioeconomic backgrounds, as well as a variety of ages and family structures.) We are looking for this group to collaborate and consult with staff as we develop programs and resources for Youth & Community audiences. These audiences include children ages 0-18, adults & caregivers of children ages 0-18, teachers, and non-traditional educators. We are hoping to work with neurodiverse people and people with disabilities. The DAM recognizes that diversity goes beyond common categories and YAG members can expect to have their unique lived experiences respected and listened to.

Responsibilities & Reciprocity

As a group member, you can expect:

Four paid 3-hour long meetings (in-person attendance is expected for all sessions.)

Meetings will take place on Sunday afternoons (and include snacks)

- Tentative Schedule:
 - Year 1: March or April 2024 (Kick-off) May, July, and September
 - Year 2: November, January, April, July 2025 (end of cohort 2)

Each meeting will consist of:

- Warm-ups/Ways to get to know/connect with one another
- Playful and fun opportunities to experience and share feedback about museum exhibitions and programs
- Time spent exploring the museum, the museum's website, or components of programs as an individual or family
- Breaks for snacks
- Sessions will be conducted primarily in English with Spanish support available.
- Some sessions may require some prep work, which will be communicated via email with notice
 to complete the prep work. Instructions will be clearly defined, and time spent on this will be
 compensated.

Outside whole-group meetings, there will also be additional paid opportunities to share your feedback or to participate in other ways with the DAM, including:

- Audience or Age-group specific feedback (e.g. Kids only, Educators, Teen & Family, etc.)
- Reviewing digital resources

- Participating in Exhibition Planning Community Advisory groups
- Possible photo or video shoot opportunities

Who is invited?

Based on the focus of current programming, we are particularly interested in recruiting ECE teachers, middle & high school teachers, and children ages 0-8 and their caregivers. Preference will also be given to folks with disabilities (including neurodiversity), and to people with English as a second language as we work to better serve these communities. If you are a family group, we ask that you just have one grown-up/adult attend the regular, whole group sessions – however, anytime we give you an assignment to visit the museum, we will make sure you have free general admission tickets for all the adults/grown-ups in your family. We are also happy to provide free general admission tickets for other family adults/grown-ups during the session, if you are interested.

Compensation for your time:

Individual: \$50/hourFamily units: \$50/hour
