CLASS DESCRIPTION

In Watercolor: Rocky Mountain Landscape students will follow in the footsteps of artists who have captured the landscapes of the Rocky Mountains both on location, en plein air, as well as in the studio. Students will learn fundamental landscape painting skills such as perspective of the landscape, value structures in the landscape, and color theory while studying excellent examples from the Denver Art Museum's collections. Students will gain a great foundation for lifelong appreciation of landscape painting, particularly of the Rocky Mountains!

Materials:

All materials will be provided for this workshop and are included in the Studio Fee of \$30.

What to Expect:

Students will be exposed to watercolor materials and techniques through demonstrations. The main emphasis of the class will be learning and building fundamental landscape painting skills. Students will learn the basis of technique in this workshop in order to go forward exploring the wonderful medium of watercolor. Students will practice techniques in the classroom setting and visit the Western American Art Galleries of the DAM to see examples of how artists use the fundamentals of landscape painting to create original works.

Educator:

J.R. Monks is a contemporary visual storyteller of the West. He works both directly in the field and in his studio and strives to be honest and bold in his approach creating images that speak to the beauty, grit, and spectacle of the Western United States. J.R. is a 4th generation Colorado rancher and maintains a studio in his small hometown on the eastern plains near the ranch where he was born and continues to live. J.R. feels a deep connection to the landscape and those who live closely in harmony with her, and his art is a humble homage to the infinite complexity of nature. J.R. is a Signature member of the Montana and Colorado Watercolor Societies, with his work included regularly in juried shows across the country.

WORKSHOP SPACE POLICIES

About:

The Ruby Red Workshop is a dedicated space for Creative Classes and adult programs located on the first floor of the DAM's Martin Building. You can expect a traditional style art workshop with tables and four-legged chairs with backrests. There are a variety of other seating options available. Sinks, soaps, paper towels, and waste receptacles are accessible in the workshop. Restrooms are located in the elevator bay just outside the workshop entrance. Food and beverages are allowed inside the workshop space, please ensure that you do not enter any galleries with these items.

Each class is different and does not follow a strict or set structure, but will generally include instructor presentations and demonstrations, class gallery visits to view artworks in the DAM collections, individual work time supported by class instructor and assistant, and discussion or share-out time of finished works and works-in-progress.

Cleanup:

Please remove all artworks from the classroom at the end of each class. If wet paintings or in-progress artworks need to be stored in the classroom, there is limited storage on drying racks and in the equipment closet. Students must take home their own materials after each class. Please ensure that art supplies and equipment belonging to the DAM are put back in the appropriate locations. Sponges, paper towels, and cleaning solution are provided in the classroom for cleanup.

Classroom Access:
